ANGRY STAFF PROTEST Near Hospital Against Regional Pay 'Cartel'. This article was published in the Plymouth Herald on Friday, 27<sup>th</sup> July 2012.

ANGRY hospital staff protested near Derriford Hospital amid growing opposition to a regional 'pay cartel'.

Dozens of placard-waving health staff, union officials and members of the public demonstrated at Derriford roundabout yesterday morning.



It was part of a campaign against 20 NHS trusts in the south west... *including Plymouth Hospitals NHS Trust which runs Derriford Hospital*... forming a group to drive down wage costs.

An online petition against the consortium has attracted more than 12,000 signatures in less than a week.

Unions say the 'South West Pay, Terms & Conditions Consortium' is looking to break away from the national pay and conditions agreement Agenda for Change.

The move could lead to reductions in unsocial hours payments, increased working hours, cuts to annual leave and reductions in basic pay and cuts to sick pay.

A draft consortium document, leaked to The Herald, states NHS employers are increasingly recognising the need to consider "further more radical changes to the pay and conditions of the workforce". Hospitals say the group is in its early stages and no decisions have been made.

Demonstrators slammed the consortium as "disgusting, immoral" and a "kick in the teeth" for already overworked staff.

**N** HS CUTBACKS IN Numbers. This article was published in the Daily Mail on Wednesday, 25<sup>th</sup> July 2012:

THE NHS has axed 2,380 nursing posts in the past year while only 1,682 managers have gone.

But as many more nurses than managers are employed, only 0.7% of nurses have lost their jobs compared to up to 5.5% of managers.

The <u>NHS Information Centre</u> figures reveal that 13,350 posts have gone across the health service in the year.

The NHS is ring-fenced from public sector cuts but must save £20billion over the next three years for spending on care for the elderly.

Ministers claim trusts can meet these savings targets by slashing bureaucracy and running more efficiently.

But many trusts have resorted to cutting back on front line staff as well as rationing certain treatments to ensure they meet these targets.

Janet DAVIES, of the Royal College of Nursing, said: 'The pressure to save £20billion in the NHS in England is resulting in cuts to jobs, hitting the frontline hard. These cuts are real and have been ongoing for some time.' To read the full article, please click on this link.

HS WORKERS TOOK 15 Days off Sick Last Year... Compared With Just Six In the Private Sector.

Average private sector worker took 6.2 days off sick. This article was published by <u>Sophie Borland</u> in the Daily Mail on Wednesday, 25<sup>th</sup> July 2012:

The higher paid the NHS worker, the fewer sick days they are likely to take.

More than 42,000 NHS workers are calling in sick every day, figures reveal.

Some 15million days are being lost to illness each year and absence rates are twice as high as in the private sector.

Nurses and paramedics are far more likely to be off than doctors and

high-paid managers and chief executives.

On any given day 14,000 nursing staff and 11,000 ambulance workers are off ill, according to the NHS Information Centre figures.

Overall, just over 4% of all NHS employees are absent at any one time but in some trusts it is nearly 7%.

This compares with 1.6% for private sector workers and 2.6% for those employed elsewhere in the public sector.

One reason NHS staff may be more inclined to take time off is that their sickness benefit scheme is so generous.

Employees who are absent for long periods will still be paid any bonuses and overtime they are likely to have received over that time... on top of their normal wage.

And they can even go on holiday while they are supposedly off sick if they can prove it is for 'recuperation' purposes.
